Description of necessary first aid measures

Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

For non-emergency personnel

: No action shall be taken involving any personal risk or without suitable training. Evacuate surrounding areas. Keep unnecessary and unprotected personnel from entering. Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up

Small spill

Precautions for safe handling

Protective measures
